## **Last Meeting**

Craig Timmerman gave a demonstration of how to turn a square bowl. He said there are two ways to do this, the first being to take a square piece of wood and glue sides on it, turn a round bowl and knock/saw/cut off the sides, leaving a square bowl. He demonstrated the other way, to turn a square piece of wood, turning a lot of air on the outside. This way is much easier since air is easier to knock/saw/cut off of the sides when you are finished. Here are some of his examples and a shot of him at work on the demo.

**From I-10**  
Go West to exit 501. Turn south (under the Intestate). You are on 1338, Goat Creek Road, take the first road LEFT, which is Holloman. Continue straight (Holloman turns left almost immediately) and the road becomes Wood Trail. Follow Wood Trail as the house numbers get smaller. Roland Trail will come in from the left and shortly you will see # 374, also on the left.

**From Junction Hwy. (State 27)**  
Going West, pass light at Methodist Encampment. Take next right at Goat Creek Rd. and proceed about 1.9 miles, past the KOA and Shalako Estates. A sign on right will warn you of Holloman road, which is the next right. Take Holloman, but when Holloman turns left, continue straight (it becomes Wood trail). Follow Wood Trail up over the hill till you pass Roland Trail coming from left and #374 will be beyond.
