## Next Meeting, June 14, 2012

### MEETING PLACE

**Hill Country Turners** meet in the basement of the KACC (Kerr Arts & Cultural Center) at 228 Earl Garrett, Kerrville, Texas at 6:30 pm on the 2nd Thursday of the month.

### May Meeting

Regular Monthly meeting started a few minutes late due to finding buckets etc: to catch rain water pouring in, in torrents from upper floor later it was found there was at least one drain on roof stopped up with leaves and debris. A 2 inch rain in a few minutes overloaded the system, Uel and Joe went back to KACC bldg the next day and spent several hours drying and trying to salvage the clubs paperwork and very expensive tools. The meeting started with an update and discussion of the work needed for the Texas Arts and Crafts Fair, and then turned to our presenter, **Uel Clanton**. We were unable to use the projector because of the water dripping (running) down from the first floor, but Uel soldered on and talked about CA glue, uses and abuses. He demonstrated the 30 second bond of a glue block to a wood blank, and talked about other formulations of CA glue that are less irritating for use in medical applications for gluing skin, etc. Thank you Uel.

She made beads cutting them down so that drilling the holes also cut the bead free. **James Hampton** showed a neat polymer wine stopper and an inside-out wine glass handle.



**James Johnson** brought two enormous Box Elder bowls, a striking carved Siberian Elm piece and two hats. Finally, **Paul Hewett** has been volunteering at the Nimitz Museum and was asked to

make a modification to make their golf classic trophy safer. Formed from a naval shell, the trophy was dangerous and heavy with the 29 pound warhead mounted on top. Paul has made a Mahogany substitute for the lethal tip. It will be painted black, but looks great already.
