I must confess, I have never seen anyone turning a ball while he was wearing a blindfold. If he had been wearing it over his eyes I would have run for the back seats. The use of the concave blocks on the drive chucks and the live center made the whole job look fairly straight forward. It was a nice demo. and he is a good presenter. Here are some pics.

#### Show and Tell

Frequently as instructive as the demo, show-and-tell was sterling. As usual, I had a hard time keeping track of the pictures and names to go with them. If somebody wants to help with this task, I think we would all benefit, but for now, here is my best guess. If pieces are not signed, maybe members could put a post-it with their name and the wood or woods they used.

One of the first things to catch my eye was Kathy Roberts' jig for making a stage-front Christmas ornament. I've got the ornament sitting on top, but it actually is sandwiched in between the two pieces of cushioned plywood. There is even provision built into the jig for the finial and hanger. As you can see, the hole for the stage can be drilled and worked secure in the knowledge that it won't slip... Tommy Jeffers brought a chess piece (A Bishop) for a whopping large chess board. James Hampton's walnut bowl demonstrated his lemons-to-lemonade skills by greatly improving a fairly plain piece with a little tear-out with texturing and color.



Uel Clanton, known for making everything but bowls has gone back to making a few recently. A nice piece of spalted pecan was the result. Tom Canfield brought three little cherry bowls of differing design and a large ash crotch piece, still on the chuck to show how far one can go to get at the crotch figuring. Note the band to brace the thin walls well above the bottom of the piece.



Tony McComas brought a attractive piece of Big Leaf Maple burl. Paul Hewett brought a nice bradford pear bowl, a mesquite hollow form and a poor little cracked (Pecal?) hollow form that shows what happens when the carbide bit of an Easy tool is not securely fastened.
