## MEETING PLACE

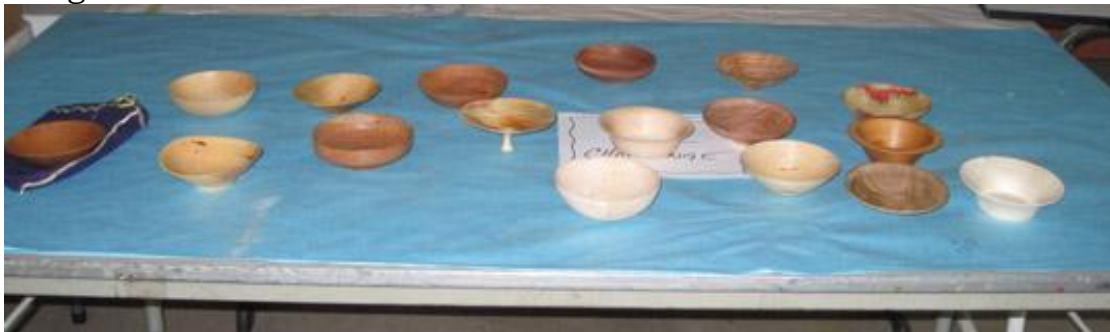

pedestal. Fantastic! Thank you Anna.

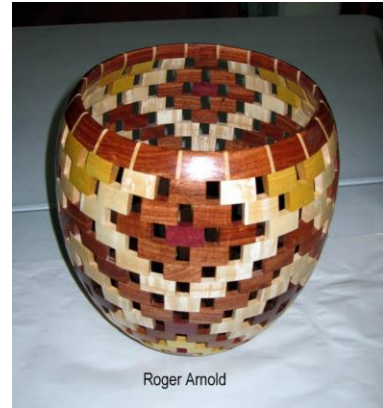

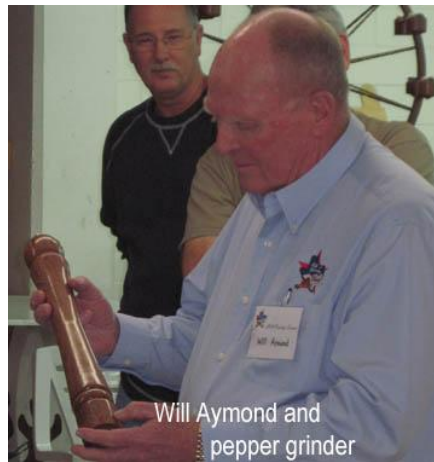
