### MEETING PLACE

**Hill Country Turners** meet in the basement at the KACC (Kerr Arts & Cultural Center) at 228 Earl Garrett, Kerrville, Texas at 6:00 pm on the 2nd Thursday of the month. The formal meeting starts at 6:30.

**SWAT:** Registration for SWAT is now open. This is the best regional show in the U.S. and a great chance to see a lot of turning and getting a lot of new ideas. If you do decide to go, sign up to help out in the room that we sponsor. You won't be losing out on part of the show because you will be there watching (and helping) a demonstrator perform.

**Demo:** James Johnson presented a brief summary of his demo on shop-built sanding pads. Many of the members had not had a chance to see this. James brings his practical ideas and experience to life like no one else. The key point is that the pads can be used in power sanding on and especially off of the lathe. The foam and shape of the pads really does minimize scoring the wood with the edge of the sandpaper. You have an excellent hand-out for the whole process that is available on the hillcountryturners.org website in the projects section. A couple of points that James emphasized is the double coating of contact cement to hold the foam firmly to the leather pads and tool attachment and stay away from water based contact cement.

**Next Meeting:** Next meeting Jerre Williams will give a demo on turning an off-center bowl/platter.

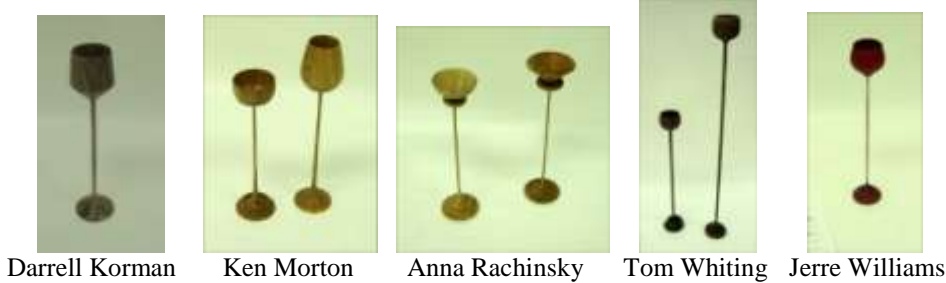
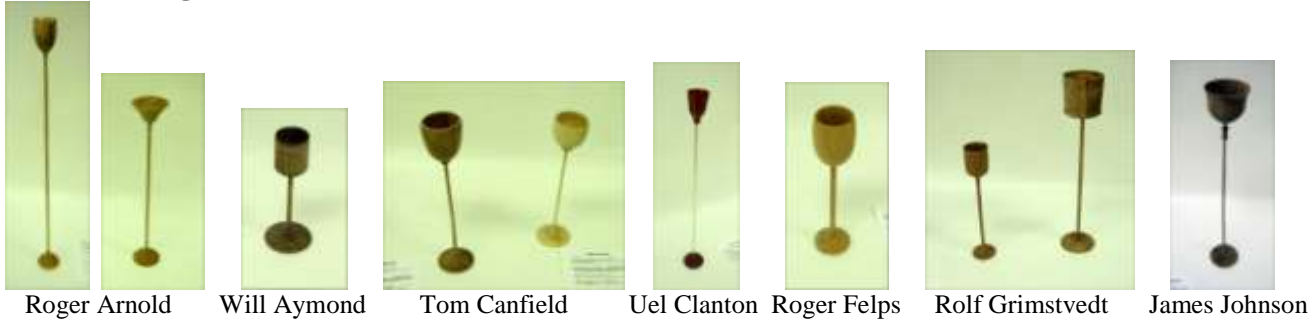
**Show-and-Tell:** James Johnson showed an amazingly distorted pecan platter that had begun to lose its shape within a few minutes of turning. Roger Arnold showed us a string steady-rest that he used to carve his long goblet for the club challenge. Anna Rachinsky brought a hollow natural edged form of pecan. Jerre Williams showed an off-center ambrosia maple platter that he learned to turn at SWAT.



Barbara Hausman showed several pieces of Texas ebony and fused glass that she made, combining two crafts to great effect. Don Kaiser, making "square" boxes felt that they needed a little something so he made tops of contrasting woods. The boxes are hackberry and maple, the tops are purpleheart and spalted cherry.
