Demo Notes: Joe Johnson. Due to the grave illness of our presenter Don Leydens, Joe came in and offered to pontificate on turning rolling pins. He showed us a whole rack of finished pins in four styles. It would serve no purpose to repeat the process, since it is readily available as a downloadable PDF file in the "Projects" section of the website. A few extra gems were spread around as he made a "typical" rolling pin with small handles at the sides. He used a sharpened 5/8 inch wrench to make a 5/8" long/wide tenon and then calipers to gauge the thickness of the rest of the handle. It would help to make a storyboard of the whole piece with the shoulder, narrowest, widest, and end-points of the handle since he stressed uniformity and balance in making the handles. He also pointed out that it is always advisable in turning a tenon to undercut the inside and insure that the

shoulder (of the handle, finial etc.) will butt against the body of the piece. He usually makes the handles from the whole cut-off of the ends to insure that colors and grains match. Here are pictures of Joe and our new A/V gantry. Both magnificent.
