## November 4<sup>th</sup>

Please mark your calendars for Saturday November 4. Our downstairs area will have the "lathes a turning".

Our project is to make Christmas trees for the Veterans living at the Kerrville VA Hospital Nursing Home. A much older name for the facility was The Soldiers Home. Now it is called the Community Living Center or CLC for short. Unlike many nursing homes in the past, a Community Living Center resembles "home" as much as possible.

Veterans may stay for a short time, or in rare instances, for the rest of their life. It is a place where Veterans receive nursing home level of care, which includes help with activities of daily living (e.g., bathing and getting dressed) and skilled nursing and medical care.

50 Christmas trees will be made to add Christmas Cheer to the Veteran's rooms. If and when more Christmas trees are made. then they would be given to the VA Volunteers who help service the nursing home.

In 1919, the Kerrville VA Hospital was the first Veterans Hospital built in Texas. Currently only 100 Community Living Centers are in the United States with 7 in Texas.

Turning wood while bringing joy to Veterans is a worthwhile project. Come and join us. Wood, encouragement, and advice is always appreciated.
